Medford/Cowtown

When I was a young lad growing up in Medford in the forties and fifties, Medford was a dairy community. In those days going to Kirby's Mill was a big deal. Farmers were in there by the dozens ordering and grinding feed for their herds. They almost had to take a number to get service.

In addition, at that time Medford had several milk platforms where farmers would place their milk cans seven days a week for pick- up by Prickett's Express. The express would deliver the milk to various creameries in Camden and Philadelphia.

There were so many dairy farms in Medford, and I am going to attempt to name all of them, knowing that I will probably miss a few.

- ➤ George Pearson's Sunny Side Farm, John Manning's farm, Fred Frohm's farm, Harry Evans's farm, Harry Wilkins's farm, Raymond Prickett's farm and Russell Worrell's farm on Medford/Lumberton Rd.
- > Albert Hennisee's farm on Wilkins Station Rd.
- > Joe Miller's farm, Ben Milich's farm, Harold Joyce's farm, Cecil Allen's farm, Ezra Evans's farm, and Herb Johnson's farm on Eayrestown Rd.

- > Harry Adams's farm and Charlie Adams's farm on New Freedom Rd.

Only two of the above-mentioned farms had their own bottling and processing capabilities and they were George Pearson's Sunny Side Dairy, and Albert Forsythe's Locust Lane Farm. Much has changed in Medford, and today the only evidence of these dairy farms is the occasional silos that dot the landscape.

Changes To The Dr. Still Project

The Dr. James Still Historic Office Site and Education Center has been an interest for many volunteers who have been working to under the umbrella of the Medford Historical Society (MHS). The site was purchased in 2006 by the NJ Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), as the Dr. Still Historic Site. Since that time, much has been accomplished by the Medford Historical Society (MHS). But work by the DEP on the stabilization and restoration of the Dr. Still Office has been slow.

In 2013, MHS formed the Dr. James Still Oversight Committee to conduct the business of the Education Center under the umbrella of the MHS. Since that time hundreds of students and interested individuals have toured the Education Center's "house museum" and walked the nature trail.

In 2019 DEP began to release funding to provide design and construction funds to "stabilize" the Dr. James Still Historic Office. However, the Education Center continued to operate on private donations and community volunteers.

At the MHS Trustee Board meeting on December 16, 2019, MHS concluded it would not sign a license agreement with the NJDEP. MHS would prefer to be an Officially Recognized Friends Organization (ORFO) to the Dr. Still Historic Site and Education Center. The Trustee Board recommended that members of the Dr. Still Oversight Committee proceed in creating their own non-profit organization. The 501(c)(3) was approved in February of 2020.

The new organization known as The Dr. James Still Historic Office Site Association, under the guidance of Mr. Sam Still, may now actively apply and manage capital improvement, preservation, and educational grants that NJ State DEP cannot apply for. Why? simply put, the State cannot give itself grants. It is the intent to go into negotiations with NJDEP and execute a License Agreement in order to apply for various grants that will support the associations mission.

MHS involvement with the Dt. Still Education Center, allowed time for a separate organization to evolve. The story of Dr. James Still ("The Black Doctor of the Pines) is a fascinating one - he was a true historical figure. For Medford, the new site is an historical treasure tells the story of a remarkable man.
