#### Medford Students Learn of our Rich History

James Still was a Medford resident who was the son of former slaves. Today, he is recognized as a master herbalist, successful entrepreneur, major land owner and author. He was born in 1812 near a wood mill in Shamong Twp. on the former Brotherton Indian Reservation.

As an African American in the mid 19th century, he faced formidable odds and constant obstacles. But with determination, and a belief in America and himself, he learned the practice of herbal medicine and built a thriving medical practice in Medford very near the intersection of Rt 541 and Church Road. It is here where his home stood until the 1930's, and his medical office still stands today. The NJ Parks Dept. now owns the property and manages it with the help of Medford Historical Society (MHS) volunteers who offer tours of the property and the Education Center.

During September and October of the past few years, MHS volunteers provided guided tours of the Still property to all Medford Public School 4th graders (about 280 children). The original office, the barns and Education Center are all part of the 20+ acre property purchased by the state about 12 years ago. A well marked walking trail begins behind the red barn. The trail is open year round for everyone to hike through the woods and fields.
